

1. How to Celebrate the Fall Feast Days of Yahuwah



Q1 Why is it important to celebrate the Feasts of Yahuwah?

Yahuwah told us to celebrate His Feasts so that we can better understand His beautiful plan of Salvation and also to get to know Him more intimately.

Q2 How do we celebrate the Feast Days of Yahuwah?

All we need is to open your Bible and study the Scriptures, especially on the topic of Yahuwah's Feast days and to meditate on His Word so we can grow closer to Him and to love Him more. You are not alone Yahuwah is with you and will be your constant companion as you spend this intimate time with Him. If possible it is always good to gather a few people together and meet at their home, sit around a table with your Bibles and read the Scriptures

and discuss them with each other. Also it is always good to sing praise songs to Yahuwah as this lifts our spirit and chases away the demonic spirits who hate it when you praise and worship Yahuwah in Spirit and in truth.

Q3 How can anyone ignore the Feasts of Leviticus 23?

These are the only yearly set-apart days of Yahuwah decreed in Scripture. No other annual observances are commanded in your Bible. In fact, Yahuwah directs us not to observe other days like the pagan holidays of Christmas, Easter, Valentine's day etc.

Q4 What is the main emphasis that Yahuwah warns His people not to do?

"Hear the word which Yahuwah speaks unto you, O house of Israel: Thus saith Yahuwah, **Learn not the way of the heathen, and be not dismayed at them. For the customs of the people are vain:** for one cuts a tree out of the forest, the work of the hands of the workman, with the axe. They deck it with silver and with gold; they fasten it with nails and with hammers, that it move not. They are upright as the palm tree, but speak not: they must needs be borne, because they cannot go. Be not afraid of them; for they cannot do evil, neither also is it in them to do good," Jeremiah 10:1-5. We are not to follow pagan holidays like Christmas, Easter, Valentines day but we are to celebrate the Seven Annual Feasts of Yahuwah.

Q5 Many people use the excuse that they are not Jewish and do not speak Hebrew therefore these feasts are not for them to celebrate. What does Scripture say about our Savior Yahusha?

The Messiah of Scripture has a real name. It is not *Jesus*. (*Greek name for Zeus*). His real name, the name which we should be pronouncing with our lips, is the name *Yahusha*. Yahusha Messiah was the promised One of the Hebrew Scriptures, who was to come and bring salvation to the world and fulfill all the promises made to the patriarchs. Yahusha spoke Hebrew and His parents Mary and Joseph were also Hebrew. Yahusha's true Hebrew name has the meaning of the explanation given by the angel to his mother Miriam (Mary). She was told, "**for he shall save his people from their**

sins." Yahusha means Yahuwah saves. Proof that Yahusha spoke Hebrew is when Paul heard Yahusha's voice on the road to Damascus. Acts 9 tells that the Apostle Paul was struck down on the Damascus road. Recounting this experience to King Agrippa (Acts 26:12-14), Paul says the voice that spoke to him from heaven did so in the Hebrew tongue, asking, "Saul, Saul, why do you persecute Me?" This was after Yahusha's death and resurrection.

Q6 Was the Scriptures written in Hebrew or Greek?

The Bible was first written in Hebrew in fact all the Old Testament was written in Hebrew. Some of the New Testament was written in Greek some in Hebrew but the original scrolls were destroyed by Constantine.

Q Do we need the Old Testament Scriptures as many people were taught by their pastors that the Old Testament is no longer relevant for today? The only Scriptures that the Apostles had were the Old Testament Scriptures. Did you know that the apostles quoted the Old Testament *695 times*, but other writers *only four times*. Yet some people insist that the teaching of the New Testament is that the Old is obsolete, only valid for a specific people during a limited time in history. Of the 27 books and letters forming the New Testament, 21 quote the Old Testament. Paul made his view of the Old Testament clear in 2 Timothy, a letter filled with instruction for a younger minister. He wrote that "from childhood you have known *the Holy Scriptures*" (2 Timothy 3:15.) He wrote that "from childhood you have known *the Holy Scriptures*" (2 Timothy 3:15.) On the road to Emmaus Yahusha walked with his disciples and said Then He said to them, 'O foolish ones, and slow of heart to believe in all that the prophets have spoken! Ought not Yahusha [the Messiah] to have suffered these things and to enter into His glory?' And *beginning at Moses and all the Prophets*, He expounded to them *in all the Scriptures* the things concerning Himself" (Luke 24;25-27). What Yahusha do immediately after His resurrection? He asked two of His followers, "Why is it so hard for you to believe what the prophets said would happen to the Messiah?" And then, from the five books of Moses and the writings of the prophets, He showed how everything that had happened was *prophesied* to happen. He *confirmed* the validity of the Scriptures. Later, Yahusha appeared to the 11

disciples and other followers. “Then He said to them, ‘These are the words which I spoke to you while I was still with you, that all things must be fulfilled which were written in the Law of Moses and the Prophets and the Psalms concerning Me.’ And He opened their understanding, *that they might comprehend the Scriptures*” (verses 44-45). Yahusha did not do away with “the Scriptures”-the Hebrew Bible-but helped His followers to *better understand and comprehend* them.

Question 7 :Who is Israel according to the Scriptures? Is it only the Israelites in the Old Testament?

True Believer who Obeys Yahuwah is called an Israelite Not a Christian. You might be shocked to know that the pagans were called Christians long before Yahusha came to be born on earth. Their religion had nothing to do with the Elohim of the Bible. The true believers who obeyed the Torah and were called Israelites followers of “The Way” also called Natzarennes. Pagan Christianity was later re-introduced and wrongly taught that this was the religion of Yahusha Messiah. Constantine wanted to unite all the pagan people under one religion so Emperor Constantine re-invented a new religion in 320AD which united pagan worshippers with true believers by forcing them by penalty of death to become Christians and join the new church. Most Hebrew Scrolls were burnt and those who refused to join this new religion which was a mixture of pagan traditions and some Bible truth were called heretics and they were forced to flee and hide in the mountains or move to other countries so as not to be persecuted and even murdered. It is not as though Yahuwah's word had failed. For not all who are descended from Israel are Israel. Romans 9;6. A person is not a Jew who is one only outwardly, nor is circumcision merely outward and physical. No, a person is a Jew who is one inwardly; and circumcision is circumcision of the heart, by the Spirit, not by the written code. Such a person’s praise is not from other people, but from Yahuwah. Romans 2;28,29. Our circumcision is no longer of the flesh but inward conversion and repentance is the true circumcision of the heart. All those who come into Covenant with Yahuwah through obedience to the Scriptures are called Israel Yahuwah’s people.

Question 8: What Does the Word “Hebrew” Mean?

Did you know that Abraham was not a Jew? Abraham was called “Abraham the Hebrew” in Genesis 14:13, which is the first time that the word is used in the Bible. Where did this term come from, and what does it mean? The word “Hebrew” in the Hebrew language is עברי (Ivrie). The root letters mean to cross over, or pass through. But what is wonderful about this passage in Joshua is that it lines up the idea of leaving behind a life of idol worship and crossing over into worshiping the One True Elohim of Israel.

Abraham crossed over and left behind pagan worship of idols to follow and obey the living Elohim.

“Put away the gods your fathers served in the region beyond the River... as for me and my house, we will serve Yahuwah”.

For Joshua the symbolism was clear: on one side of the river is idol worship, but we have left that life behind when we crossed over to the other side.

Now we will serve Yahuwah and leave behind our pagan idols.

The Bible is a consistent unit, teaching the same salvation message to all people not just the Israelites in the Old Testament.

Q9 What do Yahuwah’s feast days teach us?

First, Yahuwah’s festivals reveal the important work of the priesthood, no longer Levitical priests with animal sacrifices and temple rituals. We now look to Yahusha Messiah who is our eternal Melkitzadeq High Priest interceding for us in the Heavenly realm.

Second Yahuwah’s feast days show us proper worship through the scores of lessons they teach. The Feast days not only teach us the wonderful plan of salvation, but by keeping them as part of an obedient life, the seeker of Truth will also find the path to everlasting life.

It is no secret that the Father in heaven demands obedience while punishing disobedience. It is a fact in Old and New Testament Yahuwah does not change his laws or Feast days. **Yahuwah says in Malachi 3:6, “I change not.”** What He demanded of Israel He demands of the True Worshiper today. The statutes of old remain active statutes today.

Yahusha plainly and clearly said He did not come to destroy Yahuwah’s Commandments, statutes and judgments in Matthew 5:17. Rather, He said He came to establish them. He came to reveal their GREATER importance. He came to reveal their greater spiritual side as

well. But if they were just Jewish holidays, why was Israel commanded to keep them? The fact is the Jews or Judah made up only one of the 12 tribes of Israel. A common mistake is to interchange the terms “Jews” and “Israel” as if they were the same thing. All Jews were Israelites, but not all Israelites were Jews. **In fact, only a fraction of Israelites were Jews. (from house of Judah).**

The Jews (Hebrews) were just a part of the greater family of patriarch Jacob, whose name became Israel when he wrestled with that angel. The angel finally decided that the man wasn’t going to give up so he blessed him. That is why his name means, “Contender with Elohim.” That angel that Jacob wrestled with was Yahusha.

Q10 What does Yahuwah say about His feast days in Leviticus 23;1,2?

Almighty Yahuwah says about His Feast days in Leviticus 23:1-2:

“Concerning the feasts of Yahuwah, which you shall proclaim to be set-apart gatherings, even THESE ARE MY FEASTS.” Why didn’t He call them, “feasts of the Jews”? Because they belong to Him and were not “owned” by the Jews nor were they exclusive with them.

Keep them, Yahuwah said, because they are sanctified gatherings.

Being that they are His should be reason enough for those who desire a close relationship with the Father in heaven to include these days as a central part of their worship.

Anyone serious about their eternal future needs to look into the clear necessity to keep the Bible’s seven annual observances called Yahuwah’s Feasts. We cannot follow our own way to the Kingdom. Yahuwah Himself set down the only road to salvation and we His worshipers need to be faithful in following it, not widen the narrow way and add alternative routes as we see fit.

Q11 What is the word feast related to?

The word feast is related to a festival. The root of festival means to celebrate Yahuwah’s set-apart feast days. These seven annual observances of the Bible are packed with significance and are crucial for today’s worship in a number of ways. They are to be treated as set-apart

gatherings, they are annual Sabbaths of Yahuwah and no work is to be done on these days.

**Q12 What does each feast day of Yahuwah teach us in history?
Each of the Feasts marks a road map in the plan of salvation.**

Beyond that, they are historical and prophetic markers, as key events occurred on them and will happen again as we near the close of earth's history.

If you know the meaning of each Feast and the significance of its teachings, then you have the true key to the timetable of the Savior's return, the soon coming Seven Trumpets and Seven Last Bowls and the soon Coming of Yahusha Messiah.

Yahusha Messiah is clearly seen in every one of the annual set-apart days. If all of this is not enough to fire your interest and desire for His Feasts, Yahuwah Himself comes right out and commands the truth seeker to observe His Feast days.

If you want blessings, keep the days Yahuwah commands. Nothing on earth is more important than to receive the rewards that come with obedience to your Father in heaven. Some may still say these observances are for ancient Israel and not for them. If so, then the entire Bible is meant for someone else, seeing these Feasts are in both testaments for Israel and Gentile alike. They were observed by the apostles long after Yahusha died. He never abolished them or His Father's laws.

Others may say they just don't have the time or means to keep them, but they have no trouble finding the time and means to keep superficial worldly holidays every year, not to mention the man-made observances that lack any blessings like the Feast days.

Q13 How can you better understand the mind of Yahuwah?

What if I could tell you how to understand the mind of Yahuwah, through His festivals to show us what this life is all about and how we can please Yahuwah by living according to His set of instructions found in the Torah. Notice what Yahusha Messiah Himself says in the book of Luke 14:28 For which of you, intending to build a tower, does not sit down first and count the cost, whether he has *enough* to finish *it*.

Luke 14:29 lest, after he has laid the foundation, and is not able to finish, all who see *it* begin to mock him,

Luke 14:30 saying, 'This man began to build and was not able to finish.' And listen to this description from I. Corinthians 3 the Apostle Paul writes, he said 1 Corinthians 3:10 According to the grace of Yahuwah which was given to me, as a wise master builder I have laid the foundation, and another builds on it. But let each one take heed how he builds on it.

1 Corinthians 3:11 **For no other foundation can anyone lay than that which is laid, which is Yahusha Messiah.**

1 Corinthians 3:16 Do you not know that you are the temple of Yahuwah and *that* the Spirit of Yahuwah dwells in you? You see, Yahuwah says through inspired Scripture, He's building a magnificent spiritual building for all eternity. Construction on this structure is going on in our time and today there is much that is being accomplished and a great deal more to come. How is it that Yahuwah is completing this plan? And how can you learn about his plan and what it means for your present life and most importantly for your future and all eternity? Many study the Bible to gain understanding of Yahuwah's plan and for His purpose for humanity. They are looking for answers. Well that plan and those answers can be found from the pages of your Bible. **The plan of salvation can be found through the festival plan that Yahuwah revealed first to His people Israel and now to all Israel (all people who obey His Commandments, statutes and judgments.)** In these that are often called set-apart Days we find a blueprint that tells us exactly what is Yahuwah's eternal plan for mankind.

Yahuwah says in Scripture, these are His feasts. They never were Israel's feasts they never were nor are they today Jewish although some Jews today do keep these festivals but sadly most of them reject Yahusha Messiah They originally were and are today, Yahuwah's feasts.
