

**Just for clarification:** In my presentations I am using YHVH (Yahuwah) instead of LORD, which is a title and not a name and I am using Yahusha instead of Jesus, which is not a translation but a transliteration and really has no meaning, neither in Hebrew nor in English! YHVH (Yahuwah) and Yahusha are the actual original names and the true nature and character of them.

The Elohim of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob has promised mankind many blessings in HIS word. Many of these are conditional that means, they require something of us in order for the fullest blessings to be received. Some of the most familiar are the „be-attitudes“

*Here are some examples as we read in Matthew 5:7-9: "Blessed are the **merciful**, **for** they will be shown mercy, blessed are the **pure in heart**, **for** they will see Elohim, blessed are the **peacemakers**, **for** they will be called sons of Elohim."* KJV

YHVH has promised us his special blessings under **the condition of obedience** to His commandments, statutes and judgments. However, we can also be cursed, that means he is withholding his blessings, if we stubbornly walk in disobedience to His instructions and go our own selfish ways.

*Here is an example of a **conditional** blessing found in Exodus 15:26: "**If thou wilt diligently hearken to the voice of YHVH thy Elohim, and wilt do that which is right in his sight, and wilt give ear to his commandments, and keep all his statutes, I will put none of these diseases upon thee, which I have brought upon the Egyptians: for I am YHVH that healeth thee.**" KJV*

According to the Scriptures we can bring a blessing or a curse upon ourselves **by our words and/or our actions**; we can bless or curse other people and we can also be blessed or cursed by others. We can also, of course, be blessed or cursed by Elohim.

Yah promised to bless those people, who accept Yahusha Ha Mashiach as their personal Savior and out of a thankful heart walk in His Commandments, statutes and judgments. That simply means, we acknowledge our sins, repent of them and by His grace don't repeat them again. **If we don't do that, if we continue in our sinful ways, we give Satan and his demons the legal right to attack us.**



In the beginning Elohim blessed His creation, and believers and unbelievers alike still enjoy many of these common blessings today, like rain, sunshine, and food as examples. **We live in a fallen world as a result of Adam's disobedience. Adam sinned and brought a curse upon himself, his children and this .....**

..... beautiful planet YAH created for our benefit and enjoyment. Our whole world suffers as a result of the Adamic curse - the animals, plants, the weather, the water and the very

Yahuwah Elohim originally intended that everybody should enjoy eternal, abundant, fruitful, healthy, happy and peaceful lives. Instead we are afflicted with bloodshed, sickness, famine, hardship, depression, barrenness and death.

However, the good news is, that all is not lost, because once we become reborn children of the Living Elohim (*Elohim*) we experience His forgiveness and will consequently be blessed with eternal life, joy, peace and a sound mind. Our Heavenly Father will heal our emotions, our shattered lives and our relationship with Him, **if we submit to HIM.**




**In Genesis 8:21 Yahuwah made the following promise: “I will not again curse the ground any more for man's sake; for the imagination of man's heart is evil from his youth; neither will I again smite any more everything living, as I have done.” KJV**

In Genesis 12:3 we find a promise of blessing given to Abraham by Elohim. Amidst the blessings He freely gives to Abraham, He promises a blessing **for all others who want to participate**. Here are the very words of YHVH to Abraham in Genesis 12:3 **“And I will bless them that bless thee, and**

curse him that curseth thee: and in thee shall all families of the earth be blessed.” KJV

*This blessing is then passed on to Abraham’s son, Isaac, and to Isaac’s son Jacob, the father of the 12 tribes of Israel and the Jewish people as a whole. Here are the exact words in Genesis 27:29b: “Cursed be those who curse you and blessed be those who bless you.” Literal Translation of the Holy Bible (LITV)*

**Here is something to think about and I mean very seriously!**





## **The greatest Love Story never told!**

*Let’s go to the beginning: Yahuwah (Elohim) created man and gave him a few very simple instructions!!*

Let’s go to the beginning: Yahuwah (Elohim) created man and gave him a few very simple instructions! AND In Genesis 2:16-17 they were told: “Of every tree of the garden thou mayest freely eat: 2. BUT of the tree of

the knowledge of good and evil, thou shalt not eat of it: for in the day that thou eatest thereof thou shalt surely die.”

**But as we know Adam & Eve did not follow the instructions, they disobeyed!**

Since disobedience is sin, and sin carries a penalty, Adam and Eve were removed from Yahuwah's intimate presence and became beings that would die. They were taken from Paradise. Nevertheless YHVH continued to love them and cared for them, for we read in Genesis 3:23-24 **“YHVH Elohim sent him forth from the garden of Eden, to till the ground from whence he was taken. 24 So he drove out the man; and he placed at the east of the garden of Eden Cherubims, and a flaming sword which turned every way, to keep the way of the tree of life.” KJV**

YHVH wanted a people, a nation who would be holy to HIM and to proclaim HIM to the rest of the world! He chose Noah as the only person in his generation who still loved and obeyed HIM. As a result, out of the whole world, He saved Noah and his family. Through Noah came all of YHVH's chosen children. (Genesis 6 to 8)

*YHVH made a covenant with Abram and said in Genesis 15:5 “.... **Look now toward heaven, and tell the stars, if thou be able to number them: and he said unto him, So shall thy seed be.” KJV***

*YHVH chose Abram, later known as Abraham, who listened and obeyed HIM! Through Abram came all of Yahuwah's chosen children.*

Genesis 12:7 **“And YHVH appeared unto Abram, and said, Unto thy seed will I give this land: and there builded he an altar unto YHVH, who appeared unto him.” KJV**

Then Yahuwah chose Isaac, who was the promised child of the marriage between Abraham and Sarah in their old age.

Here is the biblical report in Genesis 21:1-7 (KJV): **“And YHVH visited Sarah as he had said, and YHVH did unto Sarah as he had spoken. 2. For Sarah conceived, and bare Abraham a son in his old age, at the set time of which Elohim had spoken to him. 3. And Abraham called the name of his son that was born unto him, whom Sarah bare to him, Isaac. 4. And Abraham circumcised his son Isaac being eight days old, as Elohim had commanded him. 5. And Abraham was an hundred years old, when his son Isaac was born unto him. 6. And Sarah said, Elohim hath made me to laugh, so that all that hear will laugh with me. 7. And she said, Who would have said unto Abraham, that Sarah should have given children suck? for I have born him a son in his old age.”**

Later YHVH chose Jacob, who was later renamed Israel. Jacob obeyed Him and sought Him diligently. Jacob had twelve sons. **They are the twelve tribes of Israel, YHVH’s chosen children.** To these tribes He said in Exodus 19:5-6:

*Exodus 19, 5-6* **“Now therefore, if ye will obey my voice indeed, and keep my covenant, then ye shall be a peculiar treasure unto me above all people: for all the earth is mine: 6. And ye shall be unto me a kingdom of priests, and an holy nation. These are the words which thou shalt speak unto the children of Israel.”** KJV

**Yahweh never changes His mind,  
what he promises, He keeps!**

*Malachi 3:6* “For I am YHVH (the LORD), I change not...” KJV

*Hebrews 13:8* “Y’shua Ha Mashiach (Jesus Christ) the same yesterday, and to day, and for ever.” KJV

*Numbers 23:19* “God is not a man, that he should lie; neither the son of man, that he should repent: hath he said, and shall he not do it? or hath he spoken, and shall he not make it good?” KJV

Jacob's children were placed in Egypt and allowed to multiply into a great nation. They were refined under the hardship of slavery and then YHVH rescued them from the hand of oppression in a mighty way. When He did, He allowed any of the natives of that land to join with the twelve tribes and to become part of His chosen people with only one instruction: the foreigner living among them is to have the same house rules that all His children have.

*Here is the proof in Exodus 12, 38 and 49 KJV* “And a mixed multitude went up also with them; and flocks, and herds, even very much cattle. 49. **One law shall be to him that is home born, and unto the stranger that sojourneth among you.**“

**Yah is the Father, and He has house rules, like all good Fathers do. If you want to live in His house, you have to follow HIS rules.**

**The same rule that applies for the home born applies to the stranger! Why?**

Think of the words of Peter in Acts 10: 34 and 35: “**Then Peter opened his mouth, and said, of a truth I perceive that Elohim is no respecter of persons: But in every nation he that feareth him, and worketh righteousness, is accepted with him.**“ *KJV*

The choice is ours to join Him. Shortly after they left Egypt, they would understand, what all of the house rules were, YHVH wrote down his instructions for them and for us. To be a holy nation, set apart to honor and worship Him, is what He desires of us. His people already knew many of these instructions, **but He wrote them all down for them anyway on two tables of stone and in a book as we read in Exodus 20 and 34!**

These instructions also defined for us **how** we were to show our love for each other. The instructions are documented in the “**Torah**” (*first five books of the Bible*). This became known as the LAW, but is more accurately defined as “**instruction**”.

YHVH promised the Israelites, that through HIS Might and Power they would conquer and occupy the Land of Canaan. So Moses send out 12 spies in order to check out the Promised Land and to bring back a report.



After their return they all talked about a Land flowing with milk and honey, but 10 of the spies insisted, that because of the walled cities and the giants they saw, Israel would not be able to conquer it. They forgot their Elohim and His promises that He would give them the Land.

Since 10 of the 12 spies, meaning the great majority, insisted that it was impossible to conquer Canaan, the people got discouraged and rebelled against Moses and YHVH! Because of their unbelief and rebellion the entire nation were disciplined by wandering for forty years in the desert until all adults over 20 had died.

Joshua and Caleb were the only ones that had brought back a good report and believed that Yahuwah is able to give them the Land. We find the report in Numbers 13:30 “**And Caleb stilled the people before Moses, and said, Let us go up at once, and possess it; for we are well able to overcome it.**” *KJV*

They were the only two adults that left Egypt that entered into the Promised Land, which Yahuwah had promised Abraham’s descendants. Joshua and Caleb emphatically stressed that the promises of Yahuwah are higher and stronger than giants, iron chariots and walled cities, and because of their strong faith they were allowed to enter the Land of Promise.

We do not need a great faith, we need to believe only in a great ELOHIM, the ELOHIM of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob. *In Matthew 17:20 Yahuwah said to his disciples: “verily I say unto you, if ye have faith as a grain of mustard seed, ye shall say unto this mountain, Remove hence to yonder place; and it shall remove; and nothing shall be impossible unto you.*” *KJV*



Though the grain of mustard seed is very small, it contains that same mysterious life principle which produces growth in the loftiest tree. If you have faith like this, you will lay hold upon Yah’s word, and nothing shall be impossible unto you. **By the way, mustard seeds have a long shelf life. That is a hint as to the value of faith.**

Samuel, the judge and prophet had two sons, that were dishonest, untrustworthy and wicked. For that reason the leaders of Israel were afraid to have his sons reign over them, as this would have catastrophic consequences for the whole nation. So they pleaded with Samuel to give them a king as the nations around them have. However, YHVH did not want them to have a human king, **He wanted to be their king**, but they insisted to have their way!

**As a loving father, He fulfilled their wish! Even though He knew that this would lead to their apostasy and destruction.**

**1. Samuel 8:7 “And YHVH said unto Samuel, Hearken unto the voice of the people in all that they say unto thee: for they have not rejected thee, but they have rejected me, that I should not reign over them.”**

**Saul was the first king of Israel!** He was anointed by Samuel. At the begin of his reign he faithfully followed the instructions of the Prophet Samuel, **but later he refused to follow YHVH in obedience to His Torah. Therefore Saul was rejected by Elohim and David was chosen as the new king of Israel.**

The Apostle Paul had the following to say about that in Acts 13:22 „**And when he had removed him (Saul), he raised up unto them David to be their king; to whom also he gave testimony, and said, I have found David the son of Jesse, a man after mine own heart, which shall fulfill all my will”.**

David's rise to power was marked by great territorial acquisitions (2. Samuel 8:1-4). Within a relative short time, Israel grew from Kingdom to Empire, and its sphere of influence – militarily and politically – expanded greatly; the imperial border stretched from the Mediterranean Sea to the Arabian Desert, from the Red Sea to the Euphrates River. (2. Samuel 8:3-13)



Despite his human weakness and mistakes, David was always a dedicated, repenting man of Elohim, who faithfully followed YHVH's instructions. After the reign of 40 years and 6 months (2. Samuel 5:5 and 1. Chronicles 3:4) David died at the age of 70 and was buried in the city of David. (1

Solomon, the son of David and Bathsheba, was the next king of Israel. He was known for his wisdom, riches and literature. **He extended his kingdom from the river Euphrates in the North to Egypt in the South.** His biggest achievement was the building of the magnificent temple in Jerusalem.

**But later we read the following about Solomon in 1. Kings 11:4 and 6:** "For it came to pass, when Solomon was old, that his wives turned away his heart after other Elohim: and his heart was not perfect with YHVH his Elohim, as was the heart of David his father."

**And YHVH was angry with Solomon, because his heart was turned from YHVH Elohim of Israel, which had appeared unto him twice." 1. Kings 11: 9 KJV** **What was Yahuwah's answer?**

**1. Kings 11:11 KJV „ Wherefore YHVH said unto Solomon, Forasmuch as this is done of thee, and thou hast not kept my covenant and my statutes, which I have commanded thee, I will surely rend the kingdom from thee, and will give it to thy servant."**

Solomon built a large kingdom, but after his death, it was divided. Solomon's son Rehoboam, threatened the people with higher taxes. The people demanded reforms, but Rehoboam accepted the advice of his younger counselors instead of the advice of the older and more experienced men. This resulted in a revolt and the kingdom was divided. (1. Kings 12)



Kings came and kings went. Some obeyed Adonai and followed Torah, and **some refused to follow Torah and served the Elohim of their heathen neighbors**. They fought each other. They ignored the instructions of their heavenly king. For that reason He withdrew his blessings from them and sent them into captivity. **Israel was conquered by the Assyrians (2. Kings 17:6) and Judah was conquered by the Babylonians (2. Chronicles 36:20).**

Here is a chronological listing of the divided kingdoms. **Judah** reigned during the time after Solomon with 20 kings, of which 12 were bad and 8 good following Torah. In **Israel** (the 10 tribes) reigned 19 kings and they all were wicked and rotten, not following the instructions of YHVH.

As mentioned, the Northern kingdom consisted of 10 tribes and was known as the kingdom of Israel. Their first king was Jeroboam and their capital Samaria. 19 kings reigned during a period of 210 years, and they all were wicked and spiritual rotten. There was not even one spiritual leader among them. Because of the lack of spiritual leadership, idolatry was the order of the day.

In His great mercy Yahuwah sent several prophets like Elijah, Elisha, and Amos etc. to Israel to warn them of the impending judgment, but they refused to listen and to repent. Therefore the kingdom fell and went in 721 BC into the Assyrian captivity.

This is recorded in 2. Kings chapter 25. This captivity was to last 70 years (see *Jeremiah 25:11-12*). During the captivity in Babylon men like Daniel and Ezekiel were moved by the Spirit of Yahuwah.

**Under Zerubbabel, Ezra and Nehemiah, Judah was permitted to return to the Promised Land and to build the temple for YHVH, even though they had committed adultery according to Jeremiah 3:8 by worshipping idols.**

*Here is the proof in Jeremiah 3:8 KJV* **“And I saw, when for all the causes whereby backsliding Israel committed adultery I had put her away, and given her a bill of divorce; yet her treacherous sister Judah feared not, but went and played the harlot also.”**



As mentioned, Judah was allowed to return to the Promised Land. This remnant of Judah served YHVH and preserved the faith of their fathers! To them was committed and entrusted the oracles of salvation!

The case with the ten tribes of Israel was a different story. Yahuwah regarded Israel's disobedience and their serving other Elohims **as adultery**. For that reason he divorced them, he separated from them.

*In Deuteronomy 28:64 their fate was prophesied:* **“And YHVH shall scatter thee among all people, from the one end of the earth even unto the other; and there thou shalt serve other Elohims, which neither thou nor thy fathers have known, even wood and stone.”** *KJV*

*Nehemiah 1, 8* “Remember, I beseech thee, the word that thou commandedst thy servant Moses, saying, if ye transgress, I will scatter you abroad among the nations.“ *KJV*

*Or Jeremiah 30:11:* “For I am with thee, saith YHVH, to save thee: though I make a full end of all nations whither I have scattered thee, yet will I not make a full end of thee: but I will correct thee in measure, and will not leave thee altogether unpunished.” *KJV*

**Was this prophecy fulfilled??**

Were the ten (10) tribes scattered among the nations of the earth?

**Let's not forget, whatever YHVH promises or prophecies will literally come to pass!**

**Furthermore, we must not forget, that “YHVH means what He says and He says what He means.”**

The loving, but sad father vowed: „**And I will scatter you among the heathen....**“ (*Leviticus 26: 33*) *And He did exactly that. **Because of their Unfaithfulness** they were scattered among the nations.*

The ten tribes were taken to Assyria as prisoners. **From there they disappeared from the records.** (*Of course the descendants of the ten tribes are not lost for YHVH, He knows exactly who they are and where they are.*)

Here is something we should seriously think about!

**Since YHVH cannot sin, which is defined as breaking His own instructions, and since one of His instructions prevented marriage to a former spouse once she has married someone else, things looked actually very bleak for the lost ten tribes of Israel, YHVH's chosen people.** Here is one of his own instructions that we find in Deuteronomy 24:1-4 *KJV:*

Deuteronomy 24:1-4 “**When a man hath taken a wife, and married her, and it come to pass that she find no favour in his eyes, because he hath found some uncleanness in her: then let him write her a bill of divorcement, and give it in her hand, and send her out of his house And when she is departed out of his house, she may go and be another man's wife. 3. And if the latter husband hate her, and write her a bill of divorcement, and giveth it in her hand, and sendeth her out of his house; or if the latter husband die, which took her to be his wife; 4 Her former husband, which sent her away, **may not take her again to be his****

**wife, after that she is defiled; for that is abomination before YHVH: and thou shalt not cause the Land to sin, which YHVH thy Elohim giveth thee for an inheritance.”**

This instruction applies not only to the marriage covenant between husband and wife, but also to the covenant between YHVH und His people, His bride!



According to what we just were reading in Deuteronomy 24:1-4 things looked bleak for the 10 lost tribes, YHVH's chosen people, because He definitely had divorced them. The big question was, how would YHVH bring those lost tribes back into covenant after the divorce?

In His grace and mercy, YHVH had a plan, because it states in Jeremiah 31:31 KJV **“Behold, the days come, saith YHVH, that I will make a new covenant with the house of Israel, and with the house of Judah.”** *(He would renew the covenant with them!)*

He begot a son of a woman. This son, who was both fully human and fully Elohim, was named Yahusha. He came to pay the ransom for Israel.



In Yahusha's own words, He came „ONLY for the lost sheep of Israel.“

*Matthew 15: 24 KJV* : “**I am not sent but unto the lost sheep of the House of Israel.**”

That is exactly what Yahusha said! He came to this earth, in order to make it possible for the 10 lost tribes of Israel, which were divorced from Him, because of their unfaithfulness, **to be part of the original covenant again.**

When Yahusha died, the penalty for Israel's sin of adultery, which was divorced from YHVH, was taken away. **All they had to do was to accept HIM as that sacrifice!**

Because it states in John 1:29 “The next day John seeth YAHUSHA coming unto him, and saith, **Behold the Lamb of Elohim, which taketh away the sin of the world!**”

**Israel could no longer be called an adulteress because her first husband was dead.**

Of course the prerequisite is, that Israel acknowledges and confesses her sin and accepts Yahusha.

1. *John 1:9 confirms this*: “**if** we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins, and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness.”

KJV

Then we read in *Proverbs 28:13* “**He that covereth his sins shall not prosper: but whoso confesseth and forsaketh them shall have mercy.**”

KJV

**This is required also from the 10 dispersed tribes of Israel!**



When Yahusha rose from the dead, the bride, who was Israel, was allowed to come back into covenant and be re-married to YHVH.

**This meant that all those from the lost ten tribes who had been scattered into the nations could now return home to YHVH. This is the promise recorded in Romans 7:1-4:**

*Romans 7:1-4* “Know ye not, brethren, **(for I speak to them that know the law,)** how that the law hath dominion over a man as long as he liveth? 2. **For the woman which hath an husband is bound by the law to her husband so long as he liveth;** but if the husband be dead, she is loosed from the law of her husband *(Paul is speaking only to those who are familiar with the Torah and not with those that do not know Torah.)* What Law or instructions is speaking about in these verses? He is talking about the law of divorce, that someone is bound by the law as long as the partner lives, which makes sense. Then he continues in verse 3 when he speaks about the marriage covenant. 3. **So then if, while her husband liveth, she be married to another man, she shall be called an adulteress: but if her husband be dead, she is free from that law; so that she is no adulteress, though she be married to another man.** 4. **Wherefore, my brethren, ye also are become dead to the law by the body of Messiah (Christ); that ye should be married to another, even to him who is raised from the dead, that we should bring forth fruit unto Elohim.**“ KJV

**From what law is the woman free?** In context it deals here mainly about the statute in Deuteronomy 24:1-4, that a divorced women, which was defiled, cannot return to her former husband, as she was considered an adulteress.

Does Romans 7:1-4 give people the permission or the right to transgress Torah as it is being preached in many churches of today? Do these verses mean that the 10 commandments, the Torah, the health laws etc. are no longer valid? **Paul does not say when the law dies, but when the man dies.**

What does Paul say at the end in verse 4? “....**that we should bring forth fruit unto Elohim.** “

He talks about bringing forth fruit! Could one quote Galatians 5:22-23? “**the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, longsuffering, gentleness, goodness, faith, Meekness, temperance.**“

Then it states at the end of verse 23: **„Against such is no law (Torah)!“**  
And why not? Because these are the fruits of the Torah!

Then it states in Leviticus 18:5 “.... Ye shall therefore keep my statutes, and my judgments: which if a man do, he shall live in them: I am YHVH .“ KJV

Or Ezekiel 20:11 “And I gave them my statutes, and shewed them my judgments, which if a man do, he shall even live in them.“ KJV

I personally believe that this text (*Romans 7:1-4*) talks about much more, namely about the 10 lost tribes of the House of Israel.



That means, that the 10 tribes of Israel, which were scattered around the world, can now return to YHVH. This is the two sticks of Ezekiel 37:16-17!

*Here are the exact words in Ezekiel 37:16-17* “Moreover, thou son of man, take thee one stick, and write upon it, For Judah, and for the children of Israel his companions: then take another stick, and write upon it, For Joseph, the stick of Ephraim, and for all the house of Israel his companions: 17. **And join them one to another into one stick: and they shall become one in thine hand.**”

KJV

That simply means, that Ephraim (*the Gentile Christians*) will accept the truth of the Torah and will no longer consider the Torah as a strange thing (*Hosea 8:12*), and at the same time Judah (Jews) will accept and serve the Messiah Yahusha Ha Mashiach.

**This is the story of the prodigal son in Luke 15:11-32. Israel left, but the house of Judah stayed.**

**This is a new covenant, better said “a renewed covenant“ made only with the House of Israel and the House of Judah at the time of the end.**



That is not all! As it was when they left Egypt, so it is today, anyone who chooses to worship the Elohim of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob is included as one of His children, to be part of

.....people as long as they are willing to follow His instructions, His Torah!

This is the greatest Love Story of all times, which is seldom talked about today. The arch enemy invented the replacement theology, which is in direct contradiction to biblical truth. Yahusha gave His life, so that His people, His divorced Bride can return to HIM again.

However, all blessings are given on the condition of obedience, no matter if the individual is home born or a stranger. We read in Jeremiah 7:23: **“But this thing commanded I them, saying, Obey my voice, and I will be your Elohim, and ye shall be my people: and walk ye in all the ways that I have commanded you, that it may be well unto you.”** KJV

1. John 1: 9 KJV **“If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins, and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness.”**

1. John 3:24 KJV **„And he that keepeth his commandments dwelleth in him, and he in him. And hereby we know that he abideth in us, by the Spirit which he hath given us.“**


## **Some are chosen, all are welcome!**

By the way, when we talk about obedience, let's not forget: Following Yahuwah's Torah to be saved is known as legalism. Following His Torah out of a thankful heart, because He ransomed us and we truly love him is called „obedience“!

It is truly high time, that people, who claim to love the Savior, that they return to obedience of His instructions, called Torah, because that is the only proof of genuine LOVE.

Love is expressed in OBEDIENCE!

1. John 2:3-4 “And hereby we do know that we know him, if we keep his commandments. 4. He that saith, I know him, and keepeth not his commandments, is a liar, and the truth is not in him.” KJV

Here is a biblical prophecy, Regarding this Love Story, Over which is much disagreement:

*Ezekiel 28:25-26 - KJV* “*Thus saith YHVH Elohim; When I shall have gathered the house of Israel from the people among whom they are scattered, and shall be sanctified in them in the sight of the heathen,*

then shall they dwell in their land that I have given to my servant Jacob. And they shall dwell safely therein, and shall build houses, and plant vineyards; yea, they shall dwell with confidence, when I have executed judgments upon all those that despise them round about them; and they shall know that I am YHVH their Elohim.”

**17. And sent his servant at supper time to say to them that were bidden, Come; for all things are now ready. 18. And they all with one consent began to make excuse. The first said unto him, I have bought a piece of ground, and I must needs go and see it: I pray thee have me excused.**

**19. And another said, I have bought five yoke of oxen, and I go to prove them: I pray thee have me excused.**

**20. And another said, I have married a wife, and therefore I cannot come.**

**21. So that servant came, and shewed his lord these things. Then the master of the house being angry said to his servant,**

**Go out quickly into the streets and lanes of the city, and bring in hither the poor, and the maimed, and the halt, and the blind. And the servant said, Lord, it is done as thou hast commanded, and yet there is room.**

**23. And the Lord said unto the servant, Go out into the highways and hedges, and compel them to come in, that my house may be filled.**

**24. For I say unto you, That none of those men which were bidden shall taste of my supper.**

*(Easy to Read Version (ERV) „None of those people I invited first will get to eat any of this food.”)*


**Why will none of the first invited people get to eat any of the food at the wedding feast?**
