



# A NOTE FOR GROWN-UPS

This page is for your child to gather memories of their pet in one place. A picture, some words, small details they don't want to forget.

There's no right way to fill it in. Some children will complete it all in one sitting. Some will come back to it over days or weeks. Some will write, some will draw, some will do a bit of both.

## A few thoughts

The prompts are gentle starting points, not rules. If your child wants to write something different in a box, that's fine. If a question feels too hard today, it can be left blank.

This can be a lovely activity to do together. You might hear stories you haven't heard before, or remember things you'd both forgotten.

## The picture space

Your child can draw their pet, or you can help them stick in a photograph. Some children prefer to draw because it feels more personal. Some like having a real photo to look at. Either works.

## Keeping it safe

Some children will want to display this page. Some will want to keep it private, tucked away with other special things. Some might want to add to it over time.

You can print extra copies if they want to start again, try a different approach, or make one for someone else who loved their pet too.
